DIED IN DUBLIN AND INTERRED AT NATIVE RATHKEALE

The death of Miss Marie O'Shaughnessy, which took place at the Mater Hospital, Dublin, on the 15th inst., is deeply regretted by a large circle of relatives and friends in her home town, Rathkeale, as well as in Dublin, where she resided in recent years (writes our Rathkeale correspondent). The late Miss O'Shaughnessy belonged to a highly respected Rathkeale family with wide connections. As a member of Cumann na mBan she was actively associated with the struggle for independence, especially during the critical years of the Black and Tan terror. Her two brothers were at the same time active members of the I.R.A. She was a sister-in-law of Mr. Michael Brannigan, a well-known Dublin cattle dealer.

The remains were brought from the Church of the Holy Family, Aughrim Street, Dublin, for burial in the New Cemetery, Rathkeale, on Sunday. On arrival at its destination the hearse was followed by a long cortege of cars, some of them coming all the way from the Metropolis. In the large attendance present at the interment could be seen many members of the I.R.A. with whom the late Miss O'Shaughnessy co-operated in memorable times.
