Wednesday, August 24th—Cattle—Entry not as large at last week; beef section included some nice heifers, which were all cashed at current rates; some medium weighted cows were also cashed, but preference was kept again this week for the heifers; heavy cows did not attract good attention and some remained unsold. Owing to the Limerick Horse Show and the Limerick Fair this week the entry in the store section was small, and buyers had not much to pick from; a couple of nice lots of two and a half year old bullocks in condition were bid for, and some changed hands at recent quotations. Small stores a slow trade. Fat heifers, best, £39 to £42; second run, £28 to £33 10s. Fat cows, best, £37 to £39; second run, £26 to £31. Old, £23 10s. to £25. Two and a half year old bullocks, £37 to £40. Two year olds, £27 10s. to £31. One and a half year olds, small, £14 10s. to £20.

Sheep—Entry about the same as last market, the bulk of the entry being nice well fed hoggets; these drew keen competition and were mostly all sold "under the hammer"; backward sheep and ewes met a slow trade; entry of lambs about the same as last week; fat lambs sold well and a couple of pens of store lambs met ready customers; all pens of lambs cleared. The sheep trade all round showed a marked improvement on last week and a good clearance. Fat middle weight, 158/- to 164/-. Hoggets, best, 160/- to 168/-; second run, 150/- to 157/-. Small, 140/- to 147/6. Fat lambs, 115/- to 135/-. Stores, 85/- to 97/6.—Wm. B. Fitt & Co., Auctioneers.
