5s. to £36; seconds, £30 15s. to £33;  
small, £27 to £29 10s. In-calf and  
calved heifers, best, £31 15s. to £38  
10s.; seconds, £24 10s. to £29 5s. Suck  
calves, £3 12s. 6d. to £7 5s.
