Sheep-Numbers on offer about the same as last Wednesday; the entry included a good proportion of prime sheep; trade, however, was quiet and purchasers endeavoured to purchase at lower rates. Choice hoggets were in most favour, and extra prime pens about held their own, but for others easier rates ruled. Increased entry of ewes, both fat and breeding, which met steady trade. Choice fat lambs also in fair demand. The small entry of store lambs met a dull market. All round trade was weaker than last week; clearance not effected.
