THE PADDOCKS, LIMERICK. WEEKLY CATTLE AND SHEEP MARKET.

Wednesday, October 5th—Cattle—Much heavier entry than last week in store section; good attendance; less beef, which sold readily, especially prime fat heifers and bullocks; cow heifers also met a strong trade; secondary and older cows changed hands at current values. Plenty of buyers to absorb what beef was shown; this section of the market was firm, with an early clearance. Best entry of store cattle for some time, forward store bullocks were wanted, and met a good trade; drafts of useful, thick, well-fed feeders met a steady sale, enquiry being the best for some time; better rates than recent markets; lots showing quality and condition changed hands readily; coloury dairy heifers also in keen demand, and well-bred young stores of the right stamp met steady enquiry and better rates. Heaviest volume of business transacted for some time, and a particularly good clearance. Fat heifers and bullocks, best, £42 to £50; second run, £33 10s. to £38 10s. Fat cows, best, £38 to £44; second run, £27 10s. to £32 15s. Old, £12 15s. to £24 5s. Two and a half and three year old store bullocks, £35 to £38 10s.; second run, £28 to £34. One and a half and two year old heifers, £26 5s. to £28; small, £17 to £25 15s. Weanlings, best, £21 5s.; small, £12 15s. to £14 10s.

Sheep—Second supplementary sheep sale was held to-day, substantial entry being received; all pen accommodation filled to capacity; full attendance of buyers. Trade opened firm and steady, the number of nice pens kept rates on an even level; prime wethers and hoggets easily placed at slightly better rates. Well fed small sheep freely bid for, with last weeks rates fully maintained. Ewes a good trade, both fat and breeding. Increased supply of lambs, useful thick sorts in brisk demand and enquired for; well-bred store lambs changed hands at steady rates;
