MR. DAVID O'BRIEN PASSES AWAY

WITH very much regret we an-nounce the death, which occurred on Saturday last, of Mr. David O'Brien, Clouncagh, father of Mr. D. O'Brien, one of the Fianna Fail Deputies for West Limerick. The deceased, who had reached an advanced age and was in poor health for a considerable time past, was manager of Clouncagh Co-operative Creamery, West Limerick, for half a century. A native of Ardfield, West Cork, Mr. O'Brien, a man of many fine parts and admirable characteristics, came to West Limerick in the pioneering days of the dairy co-operative movement and through his enterprise, ability and devotion to duty, the creamery of which he became manager attained a leading place in the South. The late Mr. O'Brien was a staunch Nationalist and during the years of the wars of independence, his home was always open night or day to the men of the I.R.A. Many of the leading men in the independence movement received welcome and shelter there, although the house was raided several times by British forces.

Mr. O'Brien was a relative of Michael Collins. He was, as stated, father of Mr. Donnchadha O'Brien, T.D., West Limerick, and also of Dr. James O'Brien, Newcastle West, and Mrs. P. Wall, Tiernahilla,
