WEST LIMERICK COAL SEAMS

It is expected that some of those company prospectors who are about to ascertain if oil exists in Tipperary and the borders of Limerick might induce others to solve the nature and value of the coal deposits which are known to exist in West Limerick and in North and East Kerry, as well as in North Cork (writes our Abbeyfeale correspondent). From time to time samples of coal have been brought to the notice of the writer from various parts of West Limerick and Kerry. They had been dug up by pump sinkers. Apart from this, geological maps show that the principal coal seams in Ireland are marked as extending from Mount-coal to Foynes into Clare, and from Newmarket, North Cork, and Mountcollins, across Barnagh to Athea (where coal has been mined), and into Glin.
