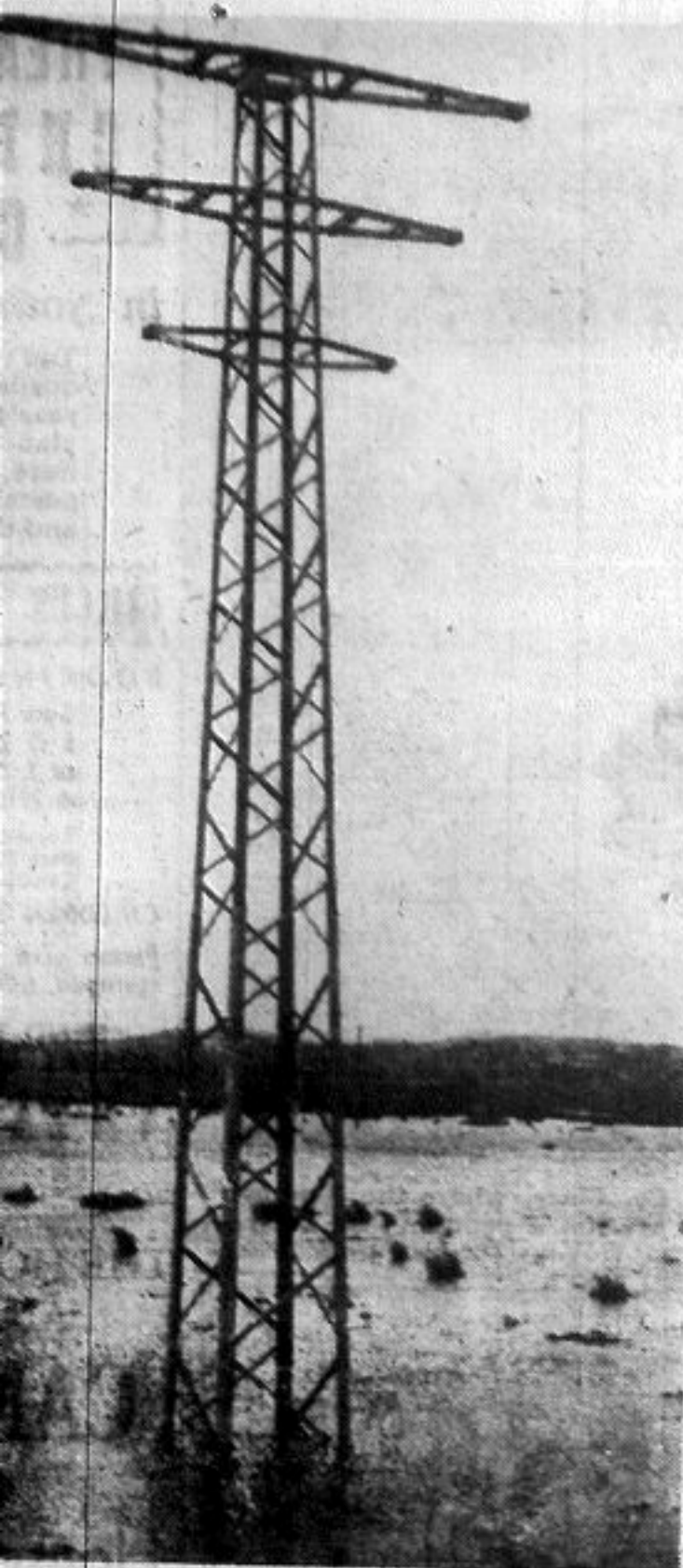


WOODS OF LIGHT

DEATH OF MISS UNA LYNCH
