ROAD WORKERS' WAGES

Mr. M. J. Keyes, Minister for
Local Government, has agreed to a
proposal of Kerry County Council
to increase the wages of its road
surfacemen by 6/- a week.

The Secretary said the Council
might get the overdraft interest re-
couped. He thought that when the
time came the Council should ask
the Minister to recoup interest char-
ges as well as all other monies spent
on the Regional Hospital.

Authority for £100,000 overdraft
accommodation was proposed by Mr.
P. H. Donegan, seconded by Mr. R.
M. Clery, and given unanimously.

MINE DISASTER

2,000 REPORTED DEAD

A Berlin message, received to-
day, states that 2,000 miners have
been killed in an uranium mine in
the East Zone of Germany, follow-
ing fierce explosions and fires.

Though this appalling tragedy
took place last Thursday, it was
only to-day that the world was told
of it for the first time.

The affected mines are situate in
Erl mountains. The origin of the
fires is unknown.

FARRANSHONE HOUSING SITES
