be explained to the deputation, he said, that, under the terms of its Charter, this Chamber was unfortunately precluded from officially associating itself in any financial arrangements which might entered into regarding this project.

There was, he added, a feeling of very genuine regret that the only action which would appear possible for the Chamber to take would be for the members to give their individual support, and also the encouragement of their friends, to ensure that the necessary funds would be raised and the unfinished memorial completed with the least possible delay.
