**PASSES AWAY IN ENNIS**

There was a great gathering of mourners and sympathisers at the funeral yesterday to Drumcliffe cemetery of Mr. William Griffin, O'Connell Square, Ennis (writes our Ennis correspondent). A native of Rath, Dysart, and a member of a well-known Clare family, Mr. Griffin started business in Ennis over 50 years ago, and throughout a long and successful commercial career was recognised as one of the most enterprising traders in the town. An ardent Irishman, he was identified with every movement for the emancipation of the country and for the welfare of his adopted town. He was about 72 years of age when death came unexpectedly.
