STATEMENT IN EJECTMENT

F = SUIT

LIMERICK woman who bought A ahouse in Limerick some years ago and who is said never to have been inside it since, because the tenant wouldn't allow her, was the plaintiff in an ejectment suit in the Limerick Circuit Court on Wednesday evening.

The plaintiff was Mary F. Collins, Stella Maris, North Circular Road. Mary O'Neill was defendant. The latter lives in 3 Alphonsus Villas, South Circular Road, which was the subject of the proceedings.

Mr. J. Kenny, B.L. (instructed by Mr. P. G. Collins, solr.), for the plaintiff, said the ejectment civil bill was for overholding. It was a most unusual case of its kind.

HELD AT QUARTERLY RENT.

"The house," he said, "is held by the defendant under a contract of tenancy dated May 6th, 1933, at a quarterly rent of £11 10s. Mrs. Collins acquired the premises; subject to the tenancy, in 1943. And from the time she purchased the premises, Mrs. Collins has asked the defendant on a number of t mes to allow her to view them, but the defendant had refused. Mrs. Collins, having purchased the house. has never seen its inside. The correspondence will show that at least on five or six occasions the defendant absolutely refused her to see
