The President thanked the members for her re-election and a delicious tea, served by the hostesses, brought an enjoyable and social evening to a close.

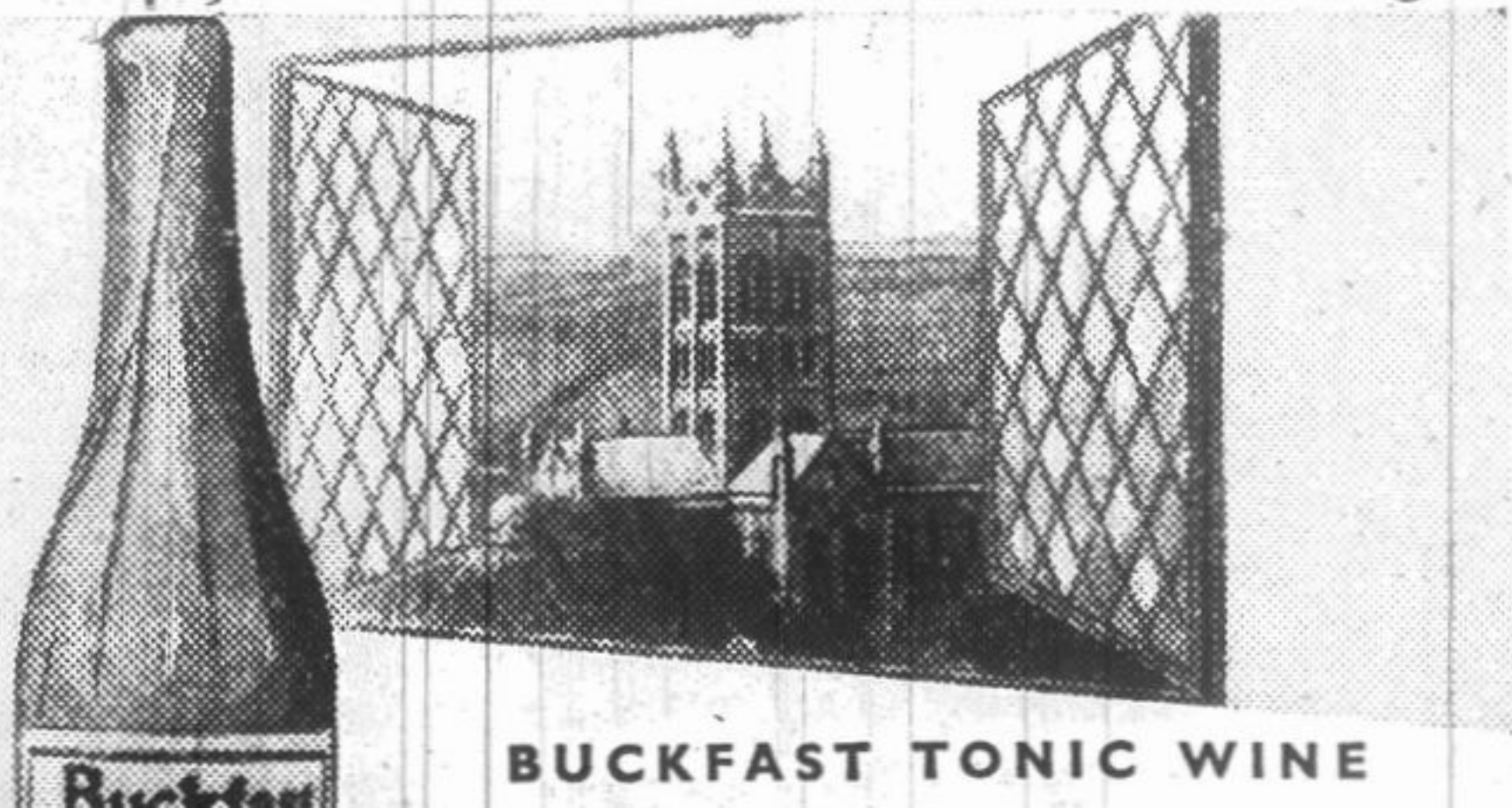
LATE MAURICE DAFFY
