## THE PADDOCKS, LIMERICK WEEKLY CATTLE AND SHEEP MARKET

Wednesday, February 1.—In the cattle section a full seasonable entry, and a good show of fat, forward and store cattle; good attendance; the beef department included a fair proportion of prime heifers, which were in steady demand at top current rates, especially medium weighted heifers and bullocks; prime fat cattle in brisk demand and wanted; cows, heifers and fresh young beef cows also met firm trade at advanced rates; all round prime fat cattle dealer than last week; secondary and old cows met a steady trade and canners found favour at late rates; almost a complete clearance effected. A useful entry of forward stores, which met brisk enquiry; well fed feeding bullocks with quality easily sold at full terms, choice drafts making up to £42 10s. Promising young stores of the right stamp were readily bid for, particularly two year old bullocks and choice colour dairy heifers, rates in favour of vendors, and well up to recent markets; useful commercial cattle wanted, also nice small stores. Choice yearlings met a firm trade at late rates. Substantial volume of business transacted, market being almost cleared.

Fat heifers and bullocks, best, £46 10s. to £53; second run, £39 15s. to £43; small, £33 to £36 10s. Fat cows, best, £39 10s. to £45 10s.; second run, £26 10s. to £33 10s.; old, £17 10s. to £24 10s. 2½ and 3 year old bullocks, best, £39 to £42 10s.; second run, £26 10s. to £34 10s. 1½ and 2 year old bullocks, best, £28 to £34; second run, £23 to £27 10s. Weanlings, best, £17 15s. to £21; second run, £11 10s. to £14s.

Sheep—Numbers about the same as last week; a useful turnout of mutton; but not quite up to last Wednesday's high standard; a steady trade for prime sheep at last week's rates; well fed wethers easy to sell, and anything with condition and quality had plenty of buyers; secondary sheep and pens lacking finish met a somewhat easier trade; no ewes on offer.
