In her first appearance on the track—nearing the end of the last season—she ran with much promise of developing into a top-class tracker. She won her trial this season in 31.64 secs. Main danger will probably be Glenside Floss and Velvet Shaggy.

Howardstown Hero will be fancied in the second event, but the class engaged is very promising.
