The death of Miss Kattie Hickey took place at her home, Clouncagh, on Friday of last week (writes our Knockadery correspondent). Deceased was a member of a very old and respected stock in the locality. She was one of the first ladies to become a member of Cumann na mBan in the Black and Tan days and was a staunch friend to the members of the flying column of the I.R.A. Close to her home in 1910 there was a running skirmish with a Black and Tan column when Jim Noonan, Newcastle West, was captured after firing his last round and throwing his empty revolver into a pool of water.

There was a very large and representative assemblage at the funeral to the local cemetery on Saturday.

The Rev. Father D. O'Callaghan, P.P., and Father D. McCarthy, C.C., officiated at the obsequies.
