## Mr. W. G. Quaid, Ballykennedy

The death of Mr. William G. Quaid, Ballykennedy House, Clouncagh, took place at his home on the morning of the 17th March (writes our Knockaderry correspondent). He belonged to a very old stock in the parishes of Clouncagh and Knockaderry. He was a practical farmer and used to ride to the County Hounds in his young days. His wife, niece of the great patriotic John Mandeville, predeceased him more than twenty years ago. He was for many years Chairman of the Coluncagh Co-Operative Dairy Society. He was brother of the late Mr. J. J. Quaide, Secretary, Limerick County Council; brother of the late Sister Ligouri, and brother of Rev. Father E. Quaid, U.S.A.. There was a very large assemblage at the removal of the remains to Clouncagh Parish Church on Friday evening, and the attendance at the funeral on Saturday was large and representative of all classes.
