TRACK racing enthusiasts will have something to cheer about in the Open Race at the local venue on Saturday night. The Management of the Limerick Track have done very well in getting together six trackers which have already this season filled the limelight.

Each runner will be fancied by connections, and thus the race will present a ticklish problem. Celtic Gem has been running with great consistency and is unbeaten this season. In this company she is unlikely to be well placed at the off and her chances of winning will depend on her position on the far side. She is very much capable of making up any leeway, and connections fancy that she will be there or thereabouts.

Street Brook is another Limerick favourite, which, if securing his best position on the rails, will take beating. Zunz and Wounded Prince can also be relied upon to show up favourably.

For the winner reliance is placed on Bold Lieutenant to break in front. This son of Laughing Lieutenant runs well over the Limerick circuit and he is given the vote. The main danger may prove to be Celtic Gem.
