### SOCIAL SECURITY PLAN

(To the Editor, "Limerick Leader.")

Dear Sir—Studying your report of the Very Rev. Dr. McEvitt's Social Security lecture and the comments therein, the following points have occurred to me:—

(1)—The Social Security Fund is to be raised by way of taxation. This method will not increase the amount of money in circulation. Are the advocates of the Bill, then, satisfied that (a) workers' present wages will allow them to contribute to the Fund without leaving their families of some of the necessities of life; and (b) that there is no gap between the money value of production and the money available for its consumption?

(2)—If (a) and (b) are not provable, is not the Social Security Bill going to worsen the immediate conditions of the workers for some future starry good?

(3)—It was stated that the success of the Social Security Scheme is dependent on "hard work." Under our existing financial system is this provable?—Yours sincerely,
