

LIMERICK I.C.A. QUARTERLY FEDERATION MEETING

Frawley, Co. Organiser, read minutes of the last meeting and signed.

President congratulated Mrs. Spratt firstly on her broadcast secondly, on her appointment as member of the Council of the Federation. She announced that she would be in charge of the produce at the "Country Fair." She invited members to bring to the Federation meeting (8th July) any articles which they intended to send to head office for the Country Fair. She reported on the organisers' meeting which she attended in Dublin. The Central Executive Committee would like if many helpers could be got to assist the Co. Organiser to visit the Guilds more than once every year.

The Committee suggested that each Federation should contribute £5 to pay the expenses of the Head Organiser, Miss Phyllis O'Connell, at the A.C.W.W. Conference to be held at Copenhagen, Denmark, from September 9th to 15th, 1950.

There was a proposal from the members present that a delegate be sent from Limerick Federation. After a long discussion on expenses, etc., it was decided to contribute £5 as requested by the Central Executive Committee.

Mrs. Spratt, Vice-President, proposed that a "bring and buy" sale be held by each Guild, and the proceeds sent to Limerick Federation before the next meeting.

Mrs. Frawley again appealed to the Secretaries to send in their reports to Mrs. Walshe, Ard House, Caherconlish. It is important that these should be sent before the annual general meeting, which will be held at Engineers' Hall, Dawson Street, on Thursday, May 4th.

The Munster Fair at Limerick this morning was of medium size. Few buyers were in attendance and as a result trade dragged at prices below recent current values. A scarcity of grass was given as the prime cause of the slackness in business. There was little or no demand for aged bullocks not in condition and in this department most of the cattle on offer remained unsold. Forward bullocks fit for shipment sold fairly well.

Average prices:—2½ year-old bullocks (in condition) £46 to £50; one outstanding lot (4 year-olds) realised £56 per head; secondary animals, £42 to £44 10s.; 2½ year-olds, £38 10s. to £43; 1½ year-olds, £28 15s. to £31 10s.; prime beef, 90/- per cwt., on foot.
