

include the seven foot figures and reliefs of the Walthamstowe Town Hall and the statue of Our Lady of Consolation of the new hospital in Lambeth Row. Elected a Fellow of the Royal Society of British sculptors in 1935, he exhibited at the Royal Academy from that year until 1946.

"In 1944 he had the signal distinction of being invited to submit a work for a representative exhibition of British sculpture to tour the United States. Only seven other artists, including Jacob Epstein and Henry Moore, were so honoured.

"For six years Mr. Kavanagh acted as Professor of Sculpture at Leeds School of Art. In 1943 a work of his was purchased for the Tate Gallery.

"Last year he was elected to the faculty of Sculpture of the British School in Rome. In 1937 he designed the British Institute of Architecture Medal for Rome scholars.

"Mr. Kavanagh's best known work in Ireland is his statue in Galway of the famous Dominican preacher and patriot, Father Tom Burke."

The distinguished artist mentioned has local connections in Limerick, as his father, who resides in London, is a first cousin of Mr. John Kavanagh, a member of the staff of the local branch of Social Welfare Department.
