LOCAL ELECTIONS ACT, 1927.

NOTICE OF ADOPTION OF SCHEME BY THE COUNCIL.

Notice is hereby given that the Limerick County Council, in pursuance of Section 14 of the above Act, adopted a Scheme on April 29 for the division of every electoral area in the County into polling districts and the appointment of polling places in every such polling district, and has submitted the Scheme to the Minister for Local Government, Custom House, Dublin, for his confirmation. Copies of the Scheme, as so submitted, may be inspected in office hours during a period of two weeks from this date, at the following places:-

Copies may be obtained on application to the Secretary of the County Council at a charge of one shilling.

Before confirming the Scheme, with or without alteration, the Minister will consider representations from any local authority or person interested submitted to him within two weeks from this date.
