Fixtures

12TH BATTALION SPORTS

THE Rockwell sprinter, N. Keane, scored another double, repeating his performance of the previous week in the 100 and 220 at the All-Ireland Colleges' Championships held at Crumlin, Dublin, on Saturday last. In the 100, with a following wind, he clocked on a rain sodden track to equal E. Flanagan's record, the best ever for a schoolboy in his country.

Provincial championship form was upset in several instances, and the mile flat provided the most thrilling event of the day. M. Byrne (Clongowes) had won the 880, and was out for the double, but going into the last it was the St. Flannan's boy, S. Curran, who looked like winning. He was tackled, however, by J. Dougan (Syne Street) and the pair ran neck-and-neck for a thrill-packed 100 yards before Dougan raced for a convincing win. Byrne then passed Curran near the line, who was unable to finish due to a cramp.

F. O'Callaghan (Glenstal) showed some of his old form in winning the 120 yards hurdles (senior), by 10 yards in 17-2 secs.

E. O'Connor (C.B.S., Limerick) was beaten at 5ft. 6ins. on fewer faults by E. O'Beirne (Clongowes) after a thrilling battle.

Munster (W. Murphy, D. Hurley, N. Gallagher and N. Keane) won the senior relay (220 x 4), Leinster being disqualified for dropping a baton.

In the intermediate 7 lb. shot event, B. McMahon (St. Flannan's) had an easy win over F. Carey (Clongowes) at 48 ft. 3 1/2 ins. in proving by 3 1/2 ins. on his throw at Cork on the previous Saturday.
