## NEARLY A CENTURY

### DEATH OF MRS. RYAN; MOANROE

Mrs. Kate Ryan of Moanroe, Newcastle West, who passed away on Monday after a comparatively brief illness, was one of the oldest, if not the oldest, residents of West Limerick (writes our Newcastle West Staff Reporter). She would have attained her century if she had survived for five more months; having been born on the 20th of November, 1850 — just two years after the great famine. Up to a few months ago when she became ill and was confined to bed, deceased was in all but perfect health and in possession of her full faculties. She was mother of one of the largest families in the records of the county and was up to recently a frequent visitor to Newcastle West. Only those who knew her intimately were aware of her remarkable age, as she displayed all the alertness of body and mind of a woman thirty years younger.

Relict of the late Daniel Ryan, deceased came from a highly esteemed and widely-respected West Limerick farming family — the Scanlans. She was mother of Mr. John Ryan, farmer, Moanroe, with whom she had resided; Miss Ryan, N.T., Raheenagh, and of Mrs. James Flanagan, Ardagh, to whom, as well as to the numerous other bereaved relatives and friends, sincere sympathy will be extended. The late Mrs. Ryan was also a relative of Mr. Eugene Scanlan, B.D.A., Newcastle West. The remains were removed amidst striking manifestations of public sympathy to Raheenagh Church on Tuesday and the funeral took place on Wednesday to Grange Cemetery.
