Limerick Consumers Hit

COSGRAVE, T.D., TO HELP

During his recent visit to Limerick Mr. Liam Cosgrave, Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Industry and Commerce, fully explained to Limerick consumers that the charges are hit by excessive charges, and he gave an assurance to do his part in having the charges redressed.

GRIEVANCE FULLY EXPLAINED.

The matter came before the general meeting of the Limerick Consumers' Association of Commerce on Monday evening, June 12, when Mr. M. W. McGuire, President, was in the chair, and the following report in regard to the charges was supplied us for publication.

The President gave a very full and complete account of the discussion which had taken place earlier in the evening, at which discussion the views of Limerick consumers were fully explained to Mr. Cosgrave, T.D., Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Industry and Commerce.

The entire position had been explained to Mr. Cosgrave by representatives from the various electricity companies who had been appointed in this capacity.

Mr. Cosgrave also explained to him that the general dissatisfaction was felt in a somewhat casual manner in the Electricity Supply Board and that the representations had been made for an adjustment of the present electricity charges in favour of Limerick.

"TIMATE COMPLAINT."

Mr. Cosgrave had given a most complete hearing to the case which was presented to him, and gave every definite assurance that he would arrange for the Electricity Supply Board to give the earliest attention to the legitimate demands which had been made on the Limerick electricity consumers.
