

AIRPORT

Seven thoroughbred racehorses, the greatest number ever to be flown across the Atlantic on one aircraft, left Shannon Airport this afternoon by Pan American Air-Freighter for New York (writes our Airport correspondent).

Three were boarded at London and four at Shannon.

Six are bound for Caracas, Venezuela and an unnamed filly by "Solferino" out of "Sun Believer" is being shipped by the Curragh Bloodstock Agency to film star Alan Ladd.

The other three Irish horses, all winners, which were consigned by Kerr's Bloodstock Agency, are "Bay Slipper," "Helen's Bay" and "Capriano."

The horses boarded at London were consigned by the Anglo-Irish Bloodstock Agency and the British Bloodstock Agency. They were:—"Sun Valley," which was sired by the Derby winner, "Hyperion"; "Garrick" and "The Trapper."
