VENUE FOR THE COUNTY CHAMPIONSHIPS

Sheehy, Vice-Chairman; Mr. V. O'Connor, Hon. Handicapper; and Mr. M. Casey, Hon. Secretary. The following clubs were represented: Limerick A.C., Kildimo A.C., and Garryowen C.C.

After a long discussion the County athletic and cycling championships were fixed for Newcastle West on Sunday, 27th August, or 3rd September. Several places were mentioned and Newcastle West was selected, subject to inspection by members of the Co. Board.
