Widespread and sincere regret has been occasioned by the death of Mr. John Mulcahy, Old Mill, Newcastle West, who passed away recently after an illness of brief duration. Deceased, who was in his early fifties, belonged to a highly respected and widely esteemed West Limerick family, and his death, in the prime of manhood, came as a great shock to his sister, Miss Kate Mulcahy, merchant, Old Mill, the other bereaved members of the family in Chicago, and a very wide circle of relatives and friends.

Of a most kindly and loveable disposition, the late Jack Mulcahy, as he was affectionately known, enjoyed the esteem and regard of all classes. 
