## FALL OF TAEJON

### The Fight In Korea

#### FIERCE TANK & INFANTRY BATTLE

IT was announced to-day from General MacArthur's headquarters that American aircraft had bombarded military positions so much around Seoul that rail traffic in that area had been brought to a standstill. Bridges in and near Seoul were extensively damaged by the raids carried out in super-fortresses.

It was also observed by air force personnel that last Sunday's heavy raid resulted in heavy damage to the enemy targets. It is claimed to-day that two North Korean fighter planes were shot down, and two others damaged, while U.S. planes, without loss, returned to their base.

#### AMERICANS WITHDRAW

After a fierce tank and infantry battle the Americans decided to withdraw to a position four miles south of Taejon. From a military point of view, it was added, the fall of Taejon carried no special significance as defending forces could not be used there to the best advantage.

There is still no news of Mayo-born Major-General Deane, who was in charge of the American 24th Infantry Division. He was last seen in action yesterday with an anti-tank team in Taejon, but there is no confirmation that he is missing. Efforts made to break through to the sector in which Major Deane was engaged have failed.

It is further reported that there was a successful counter attack overnight at Yongdok, which two days ago was taken by the North Koreans.
