CHURCHILL'S CALL FOR EUROPEAN ARMY

The freedom and the civilisation of Western Europe lies under a shield of Russian Communist aggression supported by enormous armaments, declared Mr. Churchill at the European Assembly in Strasbourg to-day when he called for the creation immediately of an unified European army.

"There is no doubt," he said, "that we are all in great danger. Soviet troops in European measure under active divisions, would outnumber the forces of the Western Union by at least six to one."

"I ask this Assembly," he continued, "to ask our German friends that if they throw in their lot with us we shall hold their safety and freedom as sacred as our own."

MURDER CHARGE

James Geraghty, aged 48 years, formerly a Civic Guard, whose address was given as Tara, was charged at a special Court in Tullamore to-day with the murder of his wife, Mary Bridget Geraghty (37).

He was remanded in custody to Portarlington.

Mrs. Geraghty died on the night of June 24th. The accused was formerly stationed in County Wexford and at Portlaoighise, and he retired in October, 1948. He was later employed on a Board of Works local drainage scheme.

DROWNING TRAGEDY AT SPIDDAL

Joseph McDonagh, Viking Road, Arbour Hill, Dublin, was drowned while swimming at Spiddal, Galway, yesterday evening. He was on holiday in the West and had been camping with two companions near the seashore.

It was stated that he went out swimming when a heavy sea was running and got into difficulties. His body was later recovered.
