

FOR G.A.A. PITCH Sale Of Co. Limerick Land

RIVAL CLAIMS TO NATIONAL GLORY!

At the meeting of Limerick Co. Council on Saturday, **Mr. J. W. Carty**, Chairman, presiding.

The question of the sale of 5 acres 13 perches of County Council land at Patrickswell to the local G.A.A. Club was raised by **Mr. Lillis**, who introduced the Club Secretary.

Mr. Lillis said the Club wanted to convert the land into a playing pitch. It was half of a site of about ten acres of land bought by the Council for £750 for housing. Half of it had been used. The balance, an inner field, was of little use to anybody in the locality. It was an accommodation site more than anything else. But the Club would be glad to buy it.

RESERVED FUNCTION OF THE COUNCIL.

The Deputy Manager said this matter had come before the Council previously and the Co. Manager had been requested to negotiate with the Club for the sale of the land. The question of the price was actually a reserved function of the Council. He didn't think the Department would sanction a lower price than £450.

Mr. Clohessy said £450 was an impossible price for a small Club. In proportion to the price the Council paid for the entire plot, it was unjust. The Council should give the plot for £350 and everybody would be satisfied.

Chairman I cannot do that. **Mr. J. Carroll**, the Club Secretary, said the Club had been badly handicapped for a number of years for want of a field.

"The G.A.A.," he pointed out, "had played no small part in the getting of freedom for our country. I believe it is the duty of the Council to stand up and honour us. Mr. Mackey has given himself and his two sons to Co. Limerick. Mr. Clohessy has also shed honour on his county. I think you owe a deep debt of gratitude to the G.A.A. Split this £400."
