**OLD I.R.A. MAN PASSES AWAY**

The death has taken place at his residence, Gurrane more, Pallasgreán, of Edmond O'Dwyer. The deceased was a great Irishman and a staunch Republican. Joining the Volunteers in 1917, he took an active part in the memorable election of 1918, when the Sinn Fein candidate, Dr. Hayes, was elected for East Limerick. As time rolled on, when stern methods had to be used to crush British rule, "Ned," as he was locally known, was in the thick of the fight, taking part in all the local activities. Outside his soldierly career he also took part in the administrative side, being Sinn Fein member of the Tipperary No. 2 District Council. When the courts were established in opposition to British laws, he was a member of the bench. A footballer of note, he played for his native county. The cortege from Nicker Church, after Requiem Mass, was one of the largest seen in the district for years.

The coffin was draped with the Tricolour and borne on the shoulders of six of his former comrades.

The guard of honour was supplied by the local Old I.R.A. men.

The prayers at the graveside were recited in Irish.

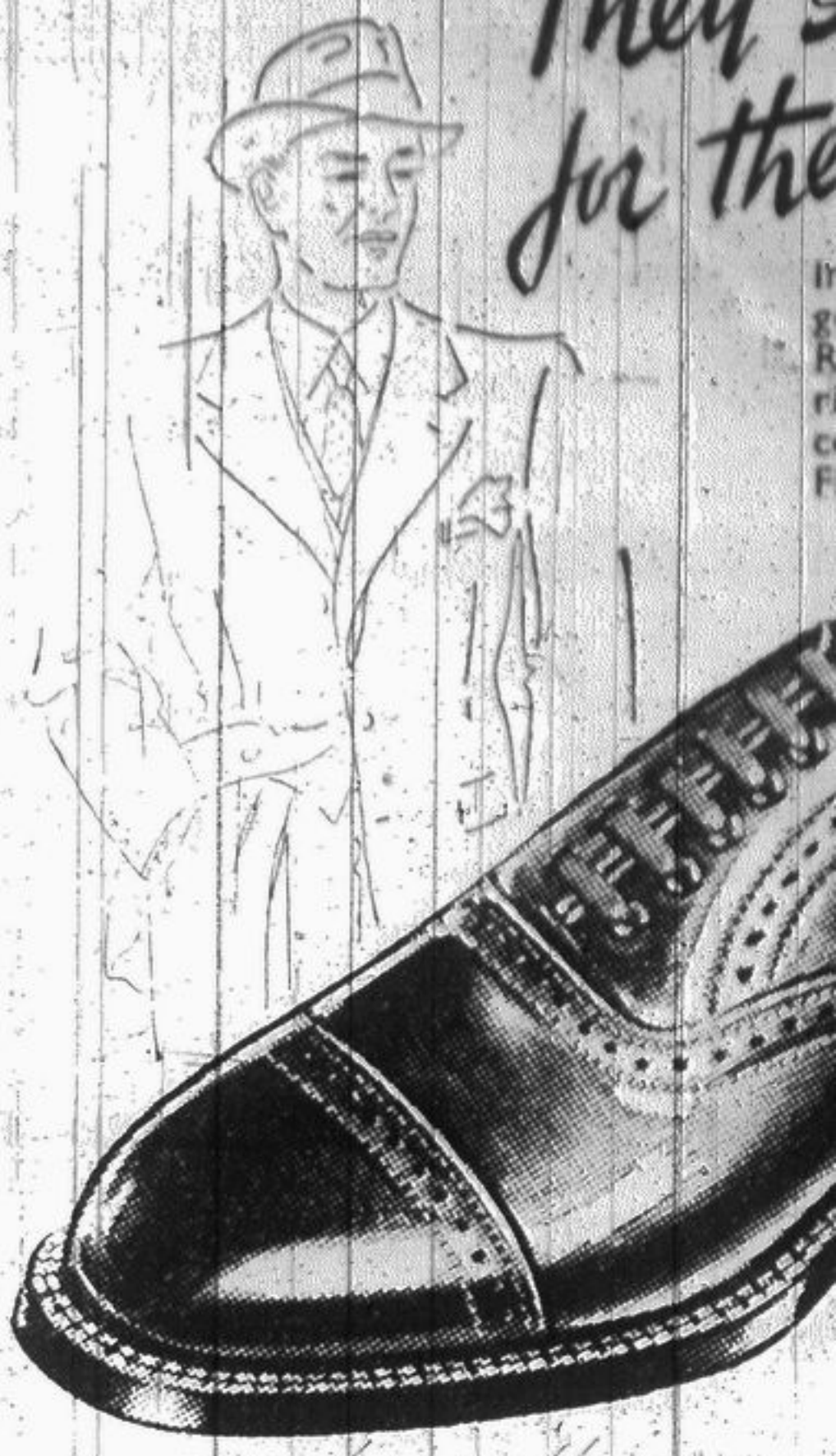
