FELL INTO RIVER

DROWNING TRAGEDY IN CORK

Michael Hegarty (30), only son
of Mr. and Mrs. Cornelius Hegarty,
Mallow Road, Doneraile, Co. Cork,
was drowned in the River Lee at
Penrose Quay, Cork, this morning.

The deceased had driven a lorry
load of pit pumps from Curra-
binny Wood, Carrigaline, to the
quay, and was unloading it when
he fell into the river.

Men who were standing by heard
the splash and saw him in the
water, but he soon disappeared be-
fore help could be rendered.

The body was recovered later.

INFANTILE PARALYSIS

CO. LIMERICK CASE REPORTED

It is reported that a case of in-
fantile paralysis has occurred in
Co. Limerick.

Our reporter interviewed Dr. Mac-
Polin, Limerick County Medical
Office of Health, and he confirmed
the report.

On being asked concerning the
disease, Dr. MacPolin stated that
there was a severe outbreak in
England and the Six Counties. The
disease presents a difficult
problem to the public authority,
because very little was known
about its mode of spread, and it
had been established that diph-
theria immunisation played a small
part in inducing the paralysis. The
position arising from this fact is
almost insoluble.

HEAVY ACCIDENT TOLL IN BRITAIN

It was stated in London to-day
