JOSEPH T. SHINNORS, GRANGE

The death occurred in St. John's Hospital, Limerick, on Friday, 18th inst., of Mr. Joseph T. Shinnors, Upper Grange, Kilmallock, in his seventieth year. He was father of Rev. Joseph Shinnors, Chaplain to the Forces in Limerick, and of Mr. George Shinnors, V.S.

A gentleman of unimpeachable character, of quiet, gentle disposition, and unobtrusive personality, he was exceptionally popular with all classes in the district and was highly esteemed for his upright character and sanctity of life.

The huge attendance present at the obsequies testified to the warm affection in which he was held in the district, and to the whole-hearted sympathy extended to his family on their very sad bereavement.

PRESENTED CUP FOR DROMKEEN SPORTS

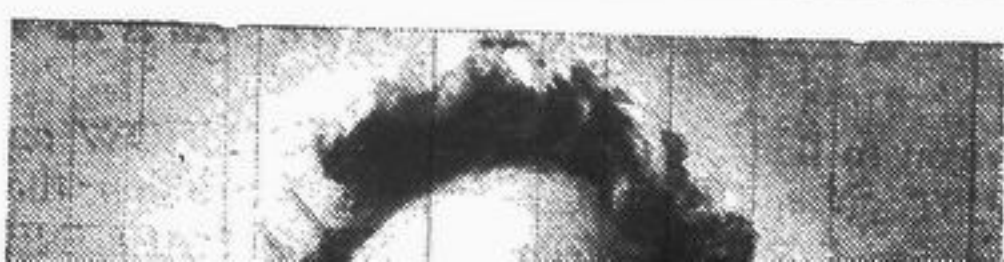
