### DEATH OF MR. P. H. O'DONNELL

A very popular and successful farmer, the late Mr. O'Donnell enjoyed the confidence and esteem of all sections of the community, as was exemplified by the very large and representative attendance at the removal of the remains to Feohenagh Parish Church on Sunday evening, and the funeral, which took place to Churchtown Cemetery, Newcastle West, on Monday, following Requiem High Mass at Feohenagh Church.
