Double Weeks' Wages Problem

NEIGHBOURS AT LAW

A CLAIM for £9 by Jeremiah O'Sullivan, shopkeeper, New Pallas, was brought against William O'Dwyer (Healy), of the same address, before Justice D. F. Gleeson in the Limerick Civil Bill Court on Monday last.

The claim was for £3 lent and £6 paid in error on foot of wages.

Mr. M. O'Brien-Kelly, solr., was for the plaintiff, while Mr. Martin Tynan, solr. (Messrs. M. Tynan & Co.) defended.

PLAINTIFF'S EVIDENCE.

Jeremiah O'Sullivan gave evidence that he employed the defendant on building operations and he worked with him from the last week in August, 1949, until the middle of October when the defendant said he had been appointed a Clerk of Works by the Limerick County Council. On a Friday evening he came to witness. The defendant had been doing work for a Patrick Kennedy and he asked if witness would give him (defendant) a loan of £3 as he did not like going home to his wife without money. Witness then gave him the £3. While employed with witness, he was paid £6 a week for the first two weeks by him (witness) and his son paid the defendant each subsequent week. His case now was that in his kitchen he paid the defendant £6 for a certain week's work, while his son also paid him in respect of the same period. Witness checked up and found that his son paid the defendant for every week that he worked. Before St. Patrick's Day witness met the defendant and told him that he had not been paid back the £3. "There is another matter, too," said witness, to the defendant on the occasion, "I paid you £6 in the kitchen and on the same day you were paid £3 by Vincent." The defendant replied that he mentioned that to him, but witness denied that he mentioned it. Some weeks afterwards witness placed £1 to the credit of his shop account when he called into his premises. The defendant denied at the time that he got £6 from witness, though he admitted being paid by his son, Vincent.
