NEWCASTLE WEST

A diploma course in rural science will begin at Newcastle West, in the Vocational School, in November.

Most Rev. Dr. O'Neill, Bishop of Limerick, has nominated Rev. J. Cagney, Raheena, Ballagh, Charleville, as teacher of sociology at the course. And at its meeting last Tuesday the Limerick County Vocational Education Committee formally approved the Bishop's nomination.

The course will be run by the U.C.C. authorities. Some of the Co. Limerick Vocational teachers will do the teaching.
