DEATH OF MRS. SADIE GLEESON.

It is with sincere regret that we record the death of Mrs. Sadie Gleeson, wife of Mr. John Gleeson, of 1 Rostown Terrace, which sad event took place at the City Hospital on Saturday morning, 30th ult.
