Tuesday, October 3. The entry showed a slight increase on last week ordinary description, including a few choice dairy cows, good attendance of buyers; trade was brisk and sharp, and choice cows found ready and willing purchasers, with a quick sale and spirited competition. Business all round was active for anything with dairy qualifications. The meat heifers on offer were of poor quality, and consequently did not attract attention, customers present looking for choice meat heifers. Almost a complete clearance in the cow section. Top price was obtained by Mr. John Mulcahy, Rath, Murroe, at £46. Dairy cows, choice, £40 to £46; promising, £36 10s. to £39 10s.; ordinary, £30 to £34. Wm. B. Pitt and Co., Auctioneers.

THE PADDOCKS, LIMERICK WEEKLY CATTLE AND SHEEP MARKET

Wednesday, October 4. Cattle. Slightly increased entry in beef section; a nice entry of medium weighted heifers and bullocks, which were in good demand and readily cashed at late rates; steady competition for prime heifers, and heifer cows of the best class; cow beef trade somewhat easier, especially for heavy cows, exceptionally good clearance in beef section. More forward stores on offer; well fed bullocks, with quality and condition, met steady selling trade, but secondary and thin stores dull and difficult to cash unless at lower values. Very small supply of young stores, trade dull and depressed. Good attendance and increased turnover. Fat heifers and bullocks, best, £48 to £52 10s.; second run, £33 to £40. Fat cows, £30 to £36 10s.; second run, £22 10s. to £27 15s.; others, £14 to £16 5s. 2 year-old bullocks and heifers, £28 10s. to £33 10s.; second run, £26 to £27 15s.

Sheep. Second Supplementary Sale held to-day, a substantial entry being received, all pen accommodation filled to capacity, and an excellent show of sheep; full attendance of buyers. Trade opened firm and steady, the number of nice pens kept rates on an even level, prime wethers and hoggets were steadily placed at full current rates, well fed sheep being freely bid for at slightly easier rates, few ewes on offer. Small entry in lamb section, choice well bred lambs in brisk demand and enquired for, also useful thick well bred store lambs, store sheep, which were in good numbers, met a steady trade. In the ram section pedigree Suffolk ram lambs met a brisk sale, Mr. J. J. Smith, Newboro', Patrickswell, topped the sale at 18 gns., 19 gns. and 14 gns. All round trade well supported, substantial turnover and clearance. Hoggets, best, 160 to 175; second run, 149 to 158.
