POPULAR FIGURE PASSED

AWAY

With very deep regret we announce the death of a deservedly popular figure, Mr. John McInerney, "Barna," Shelbourne Road, Limerick, who passed away yesterday at Kidderminster, England. The deceased, who came of highly-respected East Clare stock, was held in the warmest regard by a wide circle of relatives and friends. A man of fine qualities, he was of an exceedingly kind, good-hearted and sociable disposition. He was an active and sincere worker in the G.A.A. to which he gave great and unselfish services. Three of his sons—Michael, Liam and John—are fine exponents of hurling and Gaelic football, and his brother, Mr. Patrick McInerney, now in the United States, was a prominent All-Ireland hurler as a member of the Young Ireland Hurling Club. The late Mr. McInerney was a thoroughly patriotic Irishman and in general was a man of high, upright and attractive principles and characteristics. To his bereaved wife, sons, daughters and other relatives we extend our very sincere sympathy on their bitter sorrow.

GIRL FALLS FROM HIGH

WIRE

One of the three Camilo-Mayer German girls, high wire acrobat, fell from the tent roof on to the ring, during their performance on Saturday night last at Ballylanders (writes our correspondent there). The girls had performed many amazing feats on the high wire, and the final act, that of riding a bicycle along the wire, was about to commence, when apparently the rear wheel of the bicycle slipped off the wire and the lady rider fell to the ring. She was removed immediately unconscious and was later attended by Dr. J. C. O'Gilvie, of Ballylanders, who advised her removal to Croom Hospital, where she is progressing favourably, but suffering from shock and minor fractures. The girls were travelling with Messrs. Fossetts Circus and a special tribute must be paid to the management for the manner, unperturbed, in which they continued their show.
