With very deep regret we announce the death of a deservedly popular figure, Mr. John McInerney, "Barna," Shelbourne Road, Limerick, who died on Tuesday last, at Kidderminster, England. The deceased, who came of highly-respected East Clare stock, was held in the warmest regard by a wide circle of relatives and friends. A man of fine qualities, he was of an exceedingly kind, good-hearted and sociable disposition. He was an active and sincere worker in the G.A.A. to which he gave great and unselfish services. Three of his sons—Michael, Liam and John—are fine exponents of hurling and Gaelic football, and his brother, Mr. Patrick McInerney, now in the United States, was a prominent All-Ireland hurler as a member of the Young Ireland Hurling Club. The late Mr. McInerney was a thoroughly patriotic Irishman and in general was a man of high, upright and attractive principles and characteristics.
