UMAN AND MACARTHUR

GENERAL MacARTHUR may soon make a well-planned prohibitory landing on the East coast of North Korea.

This was reported from his headquarters to-day. Meanwhile, big advances were made on the West front by United Nations forces, and on the east by the South Koreans. News from Washington to-day came of President Truman's departure by air for California on the first leg of his journey to Wake Island in the Pacific for a conference with General MacArthur. White House sources said he would discuss with the General the possibility of drawing the line to Communist aggression in the Far East, particularly in Formosa, Indo-China and other Communist areas.

It was reported by a United Nations representative from Pusan to-day, that hundreds of thousands of South Koreans were starving, living in ruined buildings or holes in the ground.

To-day, the Icelandic Charge d'aires in Moscow conveyed to the Soviet Foreign Office his decision to close down his Legation "on economic grounds." This followed the decision of the Australian and New Zealand Governments to withdraw their Moscow Ambassadors for similar reasons.
