## UNTAXED CAR VEHICLE FOUND ON ROADSIDE

At Abbeyfeale Court before Justice D. F. Johnson, Timothy Quirke, Ahane, Knocknagoshel, was summoned by Guard McGill for using an untaxed car at Abbeyfeale.

Complainant told the Justice that he found the untaxed car on the roadside at Kilconlea. At the time there was nobody in the vehicle, and as far as witness was aware it had not since been taxed.

Mr. M. Lavan, solr., defending, explained that at the time the car was not being used by defendant, who had advertised it for sale, and had since disposed of the vehicle for scrap.

Defendant, in evidence, said he originally bought the car in May, 1949, for £100, and it was insured and taxed up to 30th June. As it was giving trouble he tried to sell it but failed to do so. On the day of the alleged offence the car was being towed to Abbeyfeale and was left temporarily on the road. The car was subsequently disposed of for £15 for scrap. Defendant added that he never used the car after the expiration of the tax.

The Justice accepted the explanation and allowed defendant off under the Probation Act.

 Daniel O'Donoghue, Rhebogue, John Street, Limerick, was summoned for having no rere light on his motor van at 11.30 p.m. on the 14th July at Croom.  
 Guard Keogh gave evidence that on the date in question and at the time mentioned he found the defendant driving the van with only one front lamp and no rere lamp.

Justice—There is only one summons against him. What did he say? Had he an excuse?

Witness—No, sir.  
 Justice—One front lamp and no rere lamp. That's bad. 20/-.

James Roche, Ballycannon, Croagh, Rathkeale, was summoned for cycling at 11.30 p.m. on the 9th July, at Croom, without a light.

Guard Keogh proved the summons, and a fine of 5/- was imposed.

Harry Murphy, c/o. Cronin's Hotel, Charleville, was summoned for using a motor lorry at Croom on the 25th August, at 10.15 p.m., without a rere red light.

Guard Keogh proved the summons, and the defendant said in evidence that he came to Croom with a workman to see if the red lamps on the road were alright. It was bright when he motored to Croom, and he thought at that time that his lamps were O.K. It was only when he stopped at Croom he was told that his red lamp was not working. This was due to a fault in the lighting system.

The Justice accepted the evidence and he dismissed the summons with a caution.
