MR. PATRICK FRAWLEY, RAHEEN, CROAGH

IT is with sincere regret we record the death of Mr. Patrick Frawley, which occurred at his residence, Raheen Croagh, on October 5th. Deceased had been in declining health for some time past, but his untimely and premature demise came as a great shock to his loving young wife, father, mother, brothers and sisters, as well as to a very wide circle of relatives and friends. Of a kindly, gentle and charitable nature, the late Patrick Frawley was deservedly popular with all sections of the community. Deceased was son of Mr. Patrick Frawley, who for a number of years was a member of the Limerick County Council; brother of Rev. Michael Frawley, C.C., Martinstown; of Mother M. Remains were removed to Croagh Parish Church on Friday, 6th Oct. After Solemn Requiem Mass on Saturday, the interment took place in Rathkeale family burial ground.

The Late Mr. John McInerney

LARGE & REPRESENTATIVE FUNERAL

THE widespread regret and sympathy evoked by the death in England last week of Mr. John McInerney, "Barra," Shelbourne Road, Limerick, found fitting expression in the large and representative attendance at the interment in Mount St. Lawrence Cemetery on Sunday last. The remains arrived on the previous day at Limerick Railway Terminus where they were met by a large number of relatives and friends, especially members of the G.A.A., in which the deceased had been a life-long, ardent and sincere worker. The late Mr. McInerney was in a very real sense a great Gael (as our special G.A.A. correspondent rightly shows in his weekly Notes in this issue). On the field and in the ballcourts he was a fine exponent of the national pastimes and later in connection with organising and propaganda activities he was a strenuous, tireless and useful worker. It was but natural, therefore, that at the interment on Sunday last there was a fine attendance of Gaels past and present. As was quite fitting, former comrades of the Young Ireland Club, with which he was so actively identified in his playing days, carried the coffin to the graveside, while members of the Treaty-Sarsfield Club, to which he was later attached, formed a Guard of Honour.
