
The Chairman, Mr. R. Reidy, on behalf of the Club, thanked Mr. Barry for coming and giving the Club two such excellent lectures.

DEATH OF MR. R. QUAID, KNOCKADERRY

With very much regret announce the death of Mr. Robert Quaid, Knockaderry, who passed away in the County Home, Newcastle West, on the 10th inst. The deceased, who came of highly respected and prominent farming stock was a widely read and most interesting figure. He took the keenest interest in literary and public affairs and in discussing them showed intelligence and enlightenment much above the ordinary. The poetic gift was strong and well developed in him, and his verses many of which appeared from time to time in the dolumns of the "Limerick Leader," were of a very creditable standard. In the early days of the Gaelic League he took an active part in the movement, studying the language and doing other practical work in the Trish-Ireland cause to which he remained devoted to the end. As an amateur actor in Gaelic League plays he showed marked ability and a fine sense of histrionic effectiveness. A kindly, sociable and highly intellectual man, he was a most entertaining conversationalist and an genial companion. exceedingly His funeral took place on Thursday of last week from Knockaderry Church to the family burial place, Clouncagh Cemetery
