## CATTLE RUSTLING

### ENGLISHMEN AGAIN

#### REMANDED

The four Englishmen who were arrested in Limerick on Wednesday night last on a charge of cattle rustling appeared briefly at Roscrea District Court to-day, where they were again formally charged. They appeared in custody.

Inspector T. Griffin, Limerick, gave formal evidence of arrest. He said his inquiries were not yet completed, and he asked for another remand in custody.

The Justice remanded the accused to the Limerick District Court on Friday week next.

The accused, all natives of Leicester, are:—William David Simpson (18), his father, John Simpson; Richard Goodrich and Richard Ledge.

Detective - Sergeant M. Murphy and Sergeant John Harrahan are also in the case.

## DEATH OF MR. P. W.

### HANNAN

Deep regret has been caused by the death last night at his residence, 6, Crescent Villas, Limerick, of Mr. Patrick W. Hannan.

The late Mr. Hannan, who had been in failing health in recent months, was attached to the staff of the Limerick Clothing Factory, Ltd., for close on sixty years. Up to the time of his passing he filled the position of Factory Manager, an appointment which he gained in 1920. During this long association with the L.C.F. he won the esteem and respect of all classes. His ability and integrity were traits which fitted him eminently for the position of Factory Manager. He will be missed by his fellow workers, and especially by the directorate of the Limerick Clothing Factory, who found in him a most capable employee.

In the social sphere the late Mr. Hannan took a keen interest in the activities of the Irish Club, and his popularity among colleagues of the Club was shown by his election to the Presidency.

#### EVIDENCE BY V.S.

Sean Hutch, V.S., Rathkeale, said that when he examined the heifer on 30th November he formed the opinion that she was suffering from chronic pneumonia. As a result of his second examination on 20th December he concluded that the heifer was definitely suffering from pleuro pneumonia and from the animal's general condition he came to the conclusion that this condition was present for at least a month previously, or even longer. The complaint was getting more chronic and after his second examination he didn't recommend any further treatment as the heifer was incurable and there was no question of its living.

Replying to Mr. Lee, witness said that on his first visit he thought the heifer might have been run down, but even then the cough was chronic, and in his opinion chronic pneumonia was present from the beginning. He did not think her condition was due to lack of food. It was very hard to say how long the complaint had been previously present in the heifer.
