EVIDENCE BY V.S.

Sean Hutch, V.S., Rathkeale, said that when he examined the heifer on 30th November he formed the opinion that she was suffering from chronic pneumonia. As a result of his second examination on 20th December he concluded that the heifer was definitely suffering from pleuro pneumonia and from the animal's general condition he came to the conclusion that this condition was present for at least a month previously, or even longer. The complaint was getting more chronic and after his second examination he didn't recommend any further treatment as the heifer was incurable and there was no question of its living.

Replying to Mr. Lee, withess said that on his first visit he thought the heifer might have been run down, but even then the cough was chronic, and in his opinion chronic pneumonia was present from the beginning. He did not think her condition was due to lack of food. It was very hard to say how long the complaint had been previously present in the heifer.
