## FOUND DEAD FARMER WHO LIVED ALONE

An inquest was held to-day by Dr. Flynn, Coroner for East Clare, touching the circumstances of the death of Michael Mulqueen, farmer, Shravokey, Clonlara, who was found dead in the kitchen of his house the previous morning.

The evidence showed that Mulqueen, aged 59, widower, lived alone. When a neighbour called on Sunday morning to bring Mulqueen's milk to the creamery he found him dead on the floor. There were signs that at the time he collapsed he was preparing his breakfast.

A verdict that death was due to heart failure was returned.
