THE ATOM BOMB QUESTION OF ITS USE IN KOREA

It was stated at General MacArthur's headquarters in Tokyo to-day that the predicament of the American 8th Army in Korea was not such as to warrant the use of the atomic bomb.

Fierce fighting along the entire front was in progress throughout the day. Two British Brigades took the brunt of the Chinese Communist assault, while other forces fell back 20 miles to a new defence line. Chinese troops continue to cross the Chongchen River in force.

The Americans strafed the Chinese from the air with the object of easing the position of the 8th Army.
