Happy River Should Win
At Limerick

DAT HOGAN'S charge, Happy River, which has two engagements in the first stage of the Limerick Christmas two-day meeting, is given a nap vote in his selected engagement.

If sent for the feature event on Tuesday, the Dunraven Cup Handicap Steeplechase, his task would be really stiff, as he will have such as Mr. Dibs, Footit, Point of Law and Copper Twist to beat. However, he is at class on his side, and is an established weight carrier over this distance. Only in his absence would I choose Copper Twist, which has run well on many occasions and is generously handicapped here.

Perhaps Happy River may be reserved for the St. Stephen's Day Chase, in which event his most dangerous rival might be Result.

The consistent Loughgur Lassie has plenty of weight in the Holiday Handicap Hurdle over two miles, in which Rose's Line, Nutty Solera and Little Boy Blue must be beaten. Nutty Solera will be a danger, but Loughgur Lassie is confidently selected.

Johnny M., on the strength of a good second to Dashing Lady at Thurles, looks a safe bet in the Greenpark Maiden Hurdle, and unlucky Moneenroe's turn may come in the Munget Novice 'Chase, in which Dashing Lady is the chief danger.
